WHAT HAPPENS ON A VERY WET/VERY HOT SCHOOL DAY?

A decision is made at morning tea if the day is wet/very hot as to whether or not school will close early at 2.30pm. A notice is placed on the school answerphone at 11.00am advising if it is an early finish. Notices are also placed on Radio 1XX and The Sun FM and our Facebook page. Buses always run at the normal time of 3.00pm and bus students are supervised until then. If you want your child to stay at school until 3pm they can and they will be supervised by their teacher. Please either ring the school, listen to a radio station or check Facebook for information if you think it may be an early finish. Please also discuss this with your child/children so that they know what to do on a very wet/very hot day. You can imagine how difficult it is to have large numbers of children trying to ring home at 2.30pm to make arrangements with their parents. Thank you for your help with this. Please note that not every wet/hot day will be an early finish.

SCHOOL HATS - Please make sure all hats are named. Students can wear their own hats to school. Any hat can be worn, as long as it is appropriate and has nothing that could cause offence on it. The hat must be worn the correct way. Students are responsible for looking after their own hat.

Please leave a message detailing the reason for the absence e.g. sickness, funeral etc. so the correct information can be entered into the system as the Ministry of Education requires that each absence has its own special code. Please phone the office (07 308-6480) to report an absence. Absences should be reported by 9.30am as we send out text alerts if a child's name appears "unmarked" at that time. Any student arriving after school starts (8.50am) needs to report to the school office for a late pass.

ASTHMA INHALERS - If your child has an inhaler, please ensure they bring it to school and know how to use it properly. We should also have these details noted in our enrolment information. We have an inhaler here if necessary but if a student is not carrying their own inhaler, we will call a caregiver before administering it. Any questions – please call the office.

Contact the office if you have any queries or concerns regarding payments. If you send payments to school with your child please ask them to call at the office before school.
