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Kia Ora Whanau

Week four of the term has been another very positive and enjoyable one for the school. Our routines and timetables are now well in place, with the students settled and familiar with their learning. The year has certainly been set up for success with the amazing start we have had, and we would like to thank all whanau for their support. This week and next does have an assessment focus as we have the students sit their E-AsTTLE tests for Panui (Reading) and Tuhituhi (Writing), as well as the PAT test for Pāngarau (Maths). These assessments are standardised, schoolwide tests for all students and help provide information for each teacher to assess where a student's learning is at, along with other in-class tests and observations. Each teacher can then look to develop and progress each student's learning in a positive and engaging way.

Cyberbullying is an important issue that is affecting large numbers of students all around the country. This form of bullying is intensely hard to manage given the numbers of students with access to any number of online social media platforms. All schools deal with regular incidents of students engaging in unsafe online behaviour, and in many cases they do not know that such behaviour is unsafe and potentially damaging. The school takes a very firm, zero tolerance approach to dealing with any type of bullying, especially cyberbullying. We want all students to understand how to keep themselves safe while online. To help with this, the school has arranged a presentation from a cyber safety expert, Mr Rob Cope. The school wants to help parents and whanau understand what the dangers of online cyber bullying are, recognise what it may look like if their child is involved and provide solutions for whanau to use so their child is kept safe. This is about whanau and the school coming together to learn how we can keep our students safe online and the presentation is free for all Whakatane Intermediate school whanau. The school would like at least one parent from each whanau to attend so we hear the messages and advice together. We have advertised this for over two weeks and we realise whanau are busy, but the school does consider this issue important and vital to ensure each student's well-being is safe. We are asking whanau to RSVP via their classroom teacher or the google doc that has been sent out. A large number of whanau have done so already, which is pleasing to see. If childcare is an issue, ie you have young ones at home, please inform your child's teacher as the school is looking into arranging some childcare at school while the presentation is on. The school is also giving out some spot prizes for whanau who attend this presentation but they must be in attendance to collect them! The presentation is at 7.00pm next Tuesday 27th February and is in the school's auditorium. We look forward to seeing you there!

Again, thank you for your support in making the start of the year so positive. The doors of Whakatane Intermediate are always open to friends and whanau. Please feel free to contact us about any concerns, questions or offers of support at any stage.
