Kia Ora Whanau,

Next week the school is holding its first Parent Teacher Hui of the year. This Hui is a great chance to catch up with your child's teacher and discuss how the beginning of the year has gone. We have had an incredibly positive start and our staff would love the opportunity to korero with you about it. Each teacher will also be able to discuss recent test results and what that means for your child's learning programme for the year. You can also discuss goals that your child has identified for the year with the teacher, and what can be done at home to support your child. Our staff also greatly value the chance to simply meet with whanau and continue the connection that was made on the first day of the year. Our Mission Statement refers to working in a collaborative partnership, which means school and whanau working together. Thanks to all whanau who have been able to book an interview with your child's teacher. There is still time to book one if whanau have not yet managed it. We look forward to seeing you next week! The goal this year is for each student to have an attendance rate of at least 90% or more throughout the year. If a student attends school 90% of the time, they are still absent for 20 days or 4 weeks over the year. This is still a significant amount of learning time that they are missing out on. Therefore attendance will be an ongoing focus all year to ensure our students attend as often as possible. Last week we had 6 classes with a 90% attendance rate, which is still very pleasing. A special well done to Room 6 who had the highest rate at 96%, and to Room 2 who had the biggest improvement from the previous week with a 8% increase with their attendance. We look forward to seeing this week's results! As an extra incentive to attend school regularly, any student who wishes to represent the school at major events will have to maintain a minimum attendance rate in line with the school's expectation. For example, to compete at the AIMS Games, go on the Cultural Trip to Samoa or be involved in the Kapa Haka or Extravaganza Festivals, students will be expected to have high attendance. It will be monitored regularly and discussed with the students to ensure they can comply.

This week I was extremely fortunate to visit Room 23 in Te Whanau O Tai Koraha, and observe their learning. They were having great fun with their spelling lesson using the "Code". This programme helps the students develop and improve their spelling by recognising the different sounds that come with words that are spelt the same. The class were doing well with their learning and developing their understanding, which was great to see. A huge thanks to Whaea Sarah Afriyie-Agyemang for creating such a positive learning environment.

#### 2024 ICAS Examination Registration

We are pleased to be offering our students the opportunity to take part in ICAS – International examinations again this year. These exams assess the students capabilities in: Spelling, Mathematics, Writing, Science, English and Digital Technologies. These are optional and if you are wanting your child to take part, they will need to get a letter from their classroom teacher. This year, we will be utilising the Parent Payment Portal, where you can register and pay for your child's exams. We will not be registering students at school so it is important for you to register online. Instructions on how to do this are clearly noted on the ICAS newsletter that can be requested from your child's teacher. The Parent Payment Portal will close on Monday  $29^{th}$  July so please register your child before this date. Examinations will be administered at school under exam regulations.
