Kia Ora Whanau,

This week the school held its first parent teacher hui for the year. What was pleasing to see was there were 540 interviews completed which means that 92% of our whanau were able to meet and discuss their children with the classroom teacher. This is very pleasing and great for the connection between school and the whanau, which can only enhance the chances of each student's achieving in 2024. A huge thank you to all those who were able to attend and we hope to see you all next time!

This week has seen a new and exciting initiative within our Technology programme. This year Te Whanau O Te Aronui, our Technology Syndicate has been able to increase the amount of learning time available to our students. Students will have their usual amount of lessons with each technology plus an intensivestyled inquiry time that is taught for an extra 9 sessions. The intention is to provide an opportunity for all students to have lessons around extending their technology skills through participating in a project with a central theme. The staff in each Syndicate will get together with the Te Aronui team and plan a series of activities that students can either opt into and/or work as a collective group to create a Syndicate-based project. The first Syndicate to have their turn is Te Whanau O Wairere which has planned activities around what it means to have Wairere as their name. The students began their lessons yesterday and were certainly excited about them. What is extra special is that with the Te Aronui team working with each individual Syndicate, there are now more opportunities as more staff are available to teach. It adds further strength to the school's overall Technology Programme, which is designed for and taught in a primary school setting, and allows the students to genuinely connect to it.

The focus on attendance continues, and we acknowledge those classes who did well in last week's results. A special well done to Room 23 who had the highest rate at 95.5%, and to Room 2 who had the biggest improvement from the previous week with an 9% increase with their attendance. We look forward to seeing this week's results! As an extra incentive for the attendance trophy, each time a class has a score of 90% or over, means an entry to the overall term prize of a pizza lunch provided by the school. So if a class attends 90% or more 6 times over the course of the term, that means they have 6 entries and 6 chances to win the big prize! So whanau, we would like your support for this idea by encouraging your children to be in the classroom as often as possible.

This week I was extremely fortunate to visit Room 6 in Te Whanau O Otamakaokao, and observe their learning. They were quietly focussed on their reading activity which involved completing activities from a book of their choice. The students knew a lot about the book they were reading and were able to discuss openly what the storyline was about. A huge thanks to Ms Tessa Parker for creating such a focussed learning environment. Ms Parker is new to our Kura this year and has settled in well to life at Whakatane Intermediate. There is a very settled and focussed atmosphere in the class, which the students are comfortable with.

ABSENCES/LATE ARRIVALS — Unless your child is ill or there are some very special circumstances, everyone is expected to attend school every day. In the case of an absence it is really important that you let the school know. Please leave a message detailing the reason for the absence e.g. sickness, funeral etc. so the correct information can be entered into the system as the Ministry of Education requires that each absence has its own special code. Please phone the office (07 308-6480) to report an absence. Absences should be reported by 9.30am as we send out text alerts if a child's name appears "unmarked" at that time. 2024 ICAS Examination Registration

We are pleased to be offering our students the opportunity to take part in ICAS – International examinations again this year. These exams assess the students capabilities in: Spelling, Mathematics, Writing, Science, English and Digital Technologies. These are optional and if you are wanting your child to take part, they will need to get a letter from their classroom teacher. This year, we will be utilising the Parent Payment Portal, where you can register and pay for your child's exams. We will not be registering students at school so it is important for you to register online. Instructions on how to do this are clearly noted on the ICAS newsletter that can be requested from your child's teacher. The Parent Payment Portal will close on Monday 29^{th} July so please register your child before this date. Examinations will be administered at school under exam regulations.

WHAT HAPPENS ON A VERY WET SCHOOL DAY? - A decision is made at morning tea if the day is wet as to whether or not school will close early at 2.30pm. A notice is placed on the school answerphone at 11.00am advising if it is an early finish. Notices are also placed on Radio 1XX and The Sun FM and our Facebook page. Buses always run at the normal time of 3.00pm and bus students are supervised until then. If you want your child to stay at school until 3pm they can and they will be supervised by their teacher. Please either ring the school, listen to a radio station or check Facebook for information if you think it may be an early finish. Please also discuss this with your child/children so that they know what to do on a wet day. You can imagine how difficult it is to have large numbers of children trying to ring home at 2.30pm to make arrangements with their parents. Thank you for your help with this.

Please note that not every wet day will be an early finish.
